Proverbs 22. A selection of wisdom sayings. A good reputation matters. Justice and generosity are what God expects from us.

James 2.1-17 Don't kowtow to rich people and neglect the poor. God honours those who are poor in material possessions. The royal law is to love your neighbour as yourself. Avoid partiality. Keep the whole law and be merciful and generous.

Mark 7.24-37 A Syrian woman asks Jesus for help. His priority is the nation he is sent to be God to tell of God's kingdom, but he sees her need and acts to help her in making her daughter better, and also healing someone who is deaf and dumb.

- Isaiah 50.4-9a The prophet celebrates his joyful teaching ministry. He is a good listener too, attends to God and copes With unfair criticism. He will continue, with God's help.
- James 3.1-12 *Teachers will be judged more strictly. Watch your tongue it can do damage.*
- Mark 8.27-38 Peter recognizes Jesus is God's Messiah but is silenced Jesus prophesies his suffering and vindication, warning us that following a crucified Messiah will be costly but will be vindicated.

- Proverbs 31.10-31 A man-ideal of a perfect wife. Very efficient, wise, kind. She should be recognized and rewarded.
- James 3.13-18 James the brother of Jesus teaches wisdom. Envy and selfish ambition bring trouble. Ask God for the right things and avoid quarrels.

Lord, we pray thee that thy grace may always prevent and follow us, and make us continually to be given to all good works; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. *BCP collect for Trinity 17*

Mark 9.30-37 Jesus again tells of his impending death and resurrection and teaches his disciples what being a Christian involves: not to be top dog but to serve. A child serves as an example. Whoever welcomes a child or a vulnerable person welcomes Christ – and so God.

Genesis 28.10-17 Jacob has a dream: a ladder from heaven with angels on it, preparing us for the gospel revealing God.

John 1.47-51 Nathaniel recognizes Jesus as Messiah, King of Israel, Jesus says he will see more. The heavens opened on Jesus the revelation of God. The Son of Man from heaven.
