

Sunday 10th November REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY (3 before Advent)

10.0 a.m. Parish Communion.

- Jonah 3.1-5 and 10 Jonah is sent to the wicked city Nineveh to tell them of God's judgment on them. They believed him and repented, fasting and wearing sackcloth, so God did not destroy the city.
- Hebrews 9.24-28 Christ ascended into heaven, to the presence of God on our behalf once and for all, unlike the Temple sacrifices which are repeated. He will come again to save those who are waiting for him.
- Mark 1.14-20 The start of Jesus' ministry in Galilee proclaiming God's rule and calling on us to repent and trust God. He then calls Simon Peter and our man Andrew to be fishers of people instead. Then James and John too.

Sunday 17th November 2nd Sunday before Advent

10.0 a.m. Parish Communion

- Daniel 12.1-3 There will be terrible times but some will be saved, including some who have died. And there will be Gods judgment on us all.
- Hebrews 10.11-25 Christ's sacrifice is once for all. Now he is at God's side. So we can approach God with confidence, in full assurance of faith, holding fast to what we have been given in him.
- Mark 13.1-8 Jesus prophesises the destruction of the Temple. (It happened 40 years later in AD70). More bad Things will happen but the end of the world is not yet.

Sunday 24th November CHRIST THE KING

10.0 a.m. Parish Communion

- Daniel 9.9-14 God on his throne hands over the role of judging the world to a human angelic figure, the Risen Jesus, whose kingdom (rule) will have no end.
- Revelation 1.4-8 Greetings from the prophet John who celebrates the risen Chrst having liberated us. He rules. John 18.33-37 Pilate and Jesus discuss true kingship God's rule is not from this world, and Jesus is the truth of God incarnate. Those who belong in it attend to what he says.
